This combination creates a very stable ribbed, tubular edge. This is useful for a corrugated rib like that used on **Da Crofter's Kep**, the 2021 free Shetland Wool Week hat pattern.

## **Ladderback Jacquard** presented by Monica MacFarland

Ladderback Jacquard is a stranded knitting technique adapted from machine knitting. It is a way to handle longer strands of non-working yarn across the back of the work and avoids trapping the floats. Essentially it creates a mesh of connected ladders behind the main design and is another knitting method to add to your knitting toolbox.

If you want to knit along cast on yarn on double points, two circs or magic loop to work in the round along with a contrasting color. Work a few rounds in stockinette to give yourself something to work with.
